



DEAFBLIND TRAINING COURSE DESCRIPTION

Tuesday, March 2, 2021 12-1pm (GMT)

Module 1: Overview of Deafblindness

This module sets the tone for the entire course; it looks at the definition of deafblindness, the causes, congenital v. acquired as well as the challenges people face.

Tuesday, March 9, 2021 12-1pm (GMT)

Module 2: Hearing and Vision Impairments

Participants will learn about the different eye and ear conditions that individuals with sensory impairments may be diagnosed with as well as the symptoms of vision loss to look out for. Participants will know how to safely guide someone who is deafblind.

Tuesday, March 16, 2021 12-1pm (GMT)

Module 3: Deafblind Awareness and Accessibility

Participants will learn about the diversity of the deafblind population through discussion and case studies. There will also be examples of accessible environments and technologies for people who are deafblind.

Module 4: Communication Part I

Module 4: Communication Part II

This is the largest of the modules, as it focuses on the main issue for people who are deafblind--Communication. Participants will learn why communication is so challenging, what the various methods look like, how we choose a mode of communication, how to set up a daily calendar, and become aware of all of the tactile strategies that individuals who are deafblind may use.

Tuesday, April 6, 2021 12-1pm (GMT)

Module 5A: Vocational Activities, Daily Living

Skills, and Community Participation for adults who are deafblind

This module will look at functional activities that adults with deafblindness and additional disabilities can engage in as well as how to encourage independence into daily living activities. We will then look at how to support people who are deafblind in the community through promoting participation and individualised communication.

OR Module 5B: Strategies for Young Children with Dual Sensory Loss

This module is primarily for parents, teachers/SNAs, professionals and caregivers of children aged 0-7 who have hearing and vision impairments including those who may have additional needs. It will look at the key strategies used in the field to increase a child's interaction, awareness, communication, and concept development.
