The Anne Sullivan Foundation supports children and adults who are deafblind across Ireland.

The Foundation works with people, families, and communities so that everyone can live a meaningful and fulfilling life.



Deafblindness is when a person may have problems with their hearing AND their vision. Sometimes their communication can be affected or they may need support walking or doing everyday activities.



The Outreach Service helps people who are deafblind where they live and learn. This support can happen in homes, schools, nursing homes, hospitals, and day services.



Anyone can use the Outreach Service if they are a child or adult with any level of both hearing and vision loss OR a family member, teacher, or professional supporting someone who is deafblind.



The Outreach Service provides person-centred support, including: Assessments, Communication Support, Independence and Daily Living Skills, Assistive Technology, Training and Advice for Others, as well as Advocacy.
